

If you do have any concerns please see a staff member, coach or manager straight away at the sport you are at so that we can look into this immediately. It is embarrassing to have complaints come through from other schools, other parents and our own students/staff about such etiquette.

Poor Car Park Behaviour

I am extremely disappointed to find out that when my staff are trying to leave the car park (in their cars), or remind people who have parked in the wrong place that they are being sworn at, and ignored. This is not okay. Cars being parked along the basketball fence line and bollards is NOT acceptable. These two areas are NOT for parking in. This has been a rule for 6 years now. Yesterday there was a traffic jam that caused annoyance. This also made it more unsafe for our students who were going to their whanau's car. Improve your practice.
